As a result, their neighborhoods are clean and beautiful. Similarly, each one of us can contribute to a cleaner environment. All kitchen waste should be collected separately. Within three or six months, we will have good garden manure. It can also be done as a community project by digging a large pit in the colony. Do take help of all the members, for nothing succeeds like cooperation.



- 2. Read the passage below:
 - 1. Our history makes it evident that the Indian Plastic Industries made a vigorous beginning in 1957 but it took more than 30 years for it to pervade Indian lifestyles. In 1979, "The market for plastics' was just being seeded by the stateowned Indian Petro- chemicals and it was only in 1994 that plastic soft drink bottles became a visible source of annoyance".
 - 2. In the same year, people in other cities were concerned about the state of public sanitation and also urged regulatory bodies to ban the production, distribution and use of plastic bags. However, the challenge was greater than it appeared at first.
 - 3. The massive generation of plastic waste in India is due to rapid urbanisation, spread of retail chains, plastic packaging from grocery to food and vegetable products, to consumer items and cosmetics. The projected high growth rates of GDP and continuing rapid urbanisation suggest that India's trajectory of plastic consumption and plastic waste is likely to increase.



- 4. According to the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) report of 2018, India stands among few other countries like France, Mongolia and several African countries that have initiated total or partial national-level bans on plastics in their jurisdictions. On World Environment Day in 2018, India vowed to phase out single-use plastics by 2022, which gave a much needed impetus to bring this change.
- 5. In this context, thereafter ten states (Andhra

Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Meghalaya, Odisha, Rajasthan and Tamil Nadu) are currently sending their collected waste to cement plants for co-processing, twelve other states/UTs are using plastic waste for polymer bitumen road construction and still four other states are using the plastic waste for wasteto-energy plants and oil production. A world of greater possibilities has now opened up to initiate appropriate and concrete actions to build up the necessary institutions and systems before oceans turn, irreversibly, into a thin soup of plastic.

6. However there is no single masterstroke to counter the challenges witnessed by the staggering plastic waste management in the country. The time is now to formulate robust and inclusive National Action Plans and while doing so, the country will establish greater transparency to combat the plastic jeopardy in a more sustainable and holistic way.



- Ans. (i) When the ironmaster accused the peddler of not being quite honest, he spoke in his defence and explained that he had never tried to pretend to be an ironmaster's acquaintance. So, he was not at fault. All along he had upheld that he was a poor trader and had pleaded to be allowed to stay in the forge. However, no harm had been done by his stay. Hence, he was willing to put on his rags again and go away.
 - (ii) Gandhi effectively managed to redress the problems of the indigo sharecroppers with the Lieutenant Governor. As a result the landlords withdrew their claims over their estates and reverted back to the farmers. The farmers learnt courage and realised that they too, had defenders. The landlords were obliged to surrender part of their money and prestige. Thus, Gandhi broke the deadlock between the farmers and the landlords.
 - (iii) It is ironic that Aunt Jennifer's creations, the tigers, will continue to pace and prance freely, while Aunt herself will remain frightened even after death. Even her death would not liberate Aunt Jennifer from the oppression that she has faced. Her fingers would remain 'ringed' with the uncle's wedding band. (i) In Edla's dealing with the peddler, she was compassionate and generous. This act of kindness by Edla towards the peddler altered his outlook towards the world. Edla had understood in the very first meeting that her father was muddling up with someone's identity to be his acquaintance. She understood this since she had observed the peddler very keenly. She knew he was either a thief or a deceitful character; however, she persuaded him to accompany her to her house to spend Christmas eve with them.

- Earlier the peddler used to think that the entire world is a big rattrap and that everything in life is a big bait. But Edla made him realise that she could see the real human being behind the swindling rattrap seller by bringing him to their house and asking him to be a part of their family at least for a single day. She also supported him when his identity was revealed. All this made the peddler see a very new side of the world. She wanted the peddler to enjoy Christmas eve and be at ease. She even invited him to be their guest on the next Christmas. He began to realise that there are good people in the world too and for that he must henceforth change his way of looking at the world.

Gandhi agreed to take 25% as a refund which the landlords offered as he explained that money was not important. The refund by the British stated that they were agreeing to what the Indians said. They were no longer dreaded by the peasants.

Gandhi did not leave Champaran after this victory. During his stay there, he had realised that the people of Champaran were culturally and socially backward, so he decided to work on this front. He decided to open primary schools so he appealed to teachers. A couple of his disciples volunteered themselves as teachers. Gandhi also took help of a doctor. Some basic ailments of the villagers were treated. Not only this, Gandhi's wife Kasturba also joined him in this movement and also taught the rules of personal cleanliness and community sanitation to the women. He kept a distant watch on his ashram also from this place and called for regular financial accounts. He even wrote them that it was time to fill in the old latrine trenches and dig the new ones. Thus, with his firm determination and persistent efforts, Gandhi was able to bring changes in the ordinary man's life.



- (i) The peddler made rat-traps of wire and went around selling them. People usually made sour faces when the peddler asked for shelter. But the crofter welcomed him in his cottage. He not only gave him food and shelter but played a game of 'mjolis' also with him. This hospitality he received from the crofter surprised him.
- (ii) The peasants were saved from spending time and money on court cases. After some years the British planters gave up control of their estates. These now reverted to the peasants. Indigo sharecropping disappeared. They realised that they too had right and defenders. Thus, the Champaran episode brought about a change in the plight of the peasants.
- (iii) Aunt Jennifer's Tigers portrays the suppression of women in a maledominated society. It showcases the constraints of a married life experienced by the women. 'Uncle's wedding band, sits heavily upon Aunt Jennifer's hand', this symbolises oppressive band of patriarchal society. He allowed Evans to wear a blanket, assumed he had left the correction paper behind by mistake and believed the information in it. He called for the police, not the ambulance.

> The Governor appointed Stephens, a new guard to guard Evans. He readily agreed to send Stephens out of the cell when Evans protested. He informed Evans that the cell was bugged and let the examination phone call go through without verifying its call authenticity. At the end, he let Evans escape a second time in a van without verifying the guards despite knowing how cunning Evans was.

(iii) The ruthless exploitation of the poor farmers by the landlords of Champaran prompted the farmers to fight endless legal battles against the landlords with the help of eminent lawyers. However, the battles were inconclusive. Terror-stricken peasants had no voice to raise and no relief in the courts against the unfair dealings of the landlords. When Gandhiji came on the scene, he viewed the entire situation and declared that there was no point in getting into litigation as law courts would hardly be able to do justice to the peasants. He felt that it was necessary to teach these downtrodden farmers how to be courageous. Until and unless they got over the terror of the Britishers, they would never experience any sense of relief, he realised. Therefore, he gave priority to empowering and emboldening the peasants rather than waging legal battles for them.

When Gandhi asked the lawyers what they would do if he went to jail, one of the senior lawyers replied that they would go back home. Gandhi then scolded the lawyers asking their obligation towards the poor peasants. He said that it would be shameful desertion on their part if they deserted the peasants in absence of Gandhi. So the lawyers realised their

mistake that if an outsider, Gandhi, was supporting the cause of the peasants, they also had social duty towards them. Hence they said that they would accompany



big fee from the poor sharecroppers. He
thought that taking such cases to the
court did little good to the crushed and
fear-stricken peasants. The relief for them,
according to Gandhi, was to be free from

fear.

- (ii) Aunt Jennifer's tigers were different from her because she herself was a timid lady whereas her tigers were symbolic of bravery, courage and fearlessness. They stand for power, strength and confidence which she lacks in herself. Aunt Jennifer created animals, i.e., tigers which were very different from her own docile character because they represented the fearlessness and freedom which she was deprived of. They also represented her secret longing to live a brave and fearless life like them.
- (iii) A Thing of Beauty, in many ways, signifies a romantic finale of Keats's firm belief in the non-destruction of beauty, and of its claim to legitimacy with reference to its permanence, and its ability to call up, or contextualize the truth. This forms the main theme of the poem. The poet's artistic view of beauty as an obstinate source of pleasure and joy comes in the face of a knowledge of the sharp problems of life, to which the essential thing of beauty offer their own mode of struggle. - (ii) Evans, also known as 'Evans the Break' was a clever thief. Originally a non-violent kleptomaniac, he was arrested multiple times which made him a thief in the end. However, he was shrewd enough to be able to escape from the prison as many as three times. He was very amusing and good at making friends. Though he did not have an attractive appearance, he had a cheerful smile which he had reserved for prison officers. He had the ability to get people to do whatever he wanted. He also had a way with deception. He took special care while disguising himself as others, especially in the first case where he disguised himself as the invigilator. We never see him losing his cool which tells us that he is supremely confident of himself and always has a backup plan in hand. With his charm and expertise, he is almost like a negative hero.
- (iii) In Champaran, the peasants were greatly in fear of the British government. The cause of the problem was indigo and the greed of the landlords. They had forced the tenants to plant 15% of their holdings with indigo and surrender the entire produce to the landlords. When synthetic indigo

came, the landlords were ready to release the above condition. They demanded compensation, the repercussions of which the peasants did not know and agreed to it. Later, when the peasants came to know about synthetic indigo, they asked for their money back. The landlords hired thugs to oppose them. Gandhi realised that there was no need for lawyers. He realised that it was necessary to release them from their fear which was difficult to achieve, as they were uneducated. However, with his determination, he championed their cause. Soon, he led a movement of nonviolence and Satyagraha. Many farmers demonstrated around the courtroom where Gandhi was summoned. This made the British feel challenged. Sharecroppers from Champaran came barefooted to see Gandhi. Muzaffarpur lawyers too called him. He explained what he had done was an ordinary thing. He had simply told the Britishers that they could not order him in his own country. Gandhi tried to mold new free Indians who could stand on their own feet. This new realisation gave him a direction to lead the freedom struggle and thus, proved to be a turning point in his life. This was the first time Gandhi realised that India was capable of mass movements and it was after this episode that he started the national struggle for freedom across the country.
